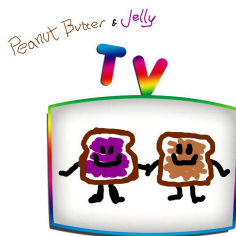

FRIDAY PM SESSIONS

Session A - Louisiana Pathways Orientation/Staff Qualifications Audit Prep by **Jenny Cowan & Penny Haire**

This orientation will provide in-depth information about Louisiana Pathways Child Care Career Development System. It will include information from both the Career Development program and the Scholarship program. This training will include information about how Pathways supports the Quality Rating System and School Readiness Tax Credits. This workshop will also help you prepare for your Quality Start staff qualifications audit. It will include pointers for completing the Staff Qualification sections of the 2-5 Star Application, an overview of the audit process, suggestions for preparing for the audit, and some common errors that you can avoid. Attendance at the first hour of this training will give approved Pathways trainers credit for the required one hour Pathways orientation.

Session B - Effective Communication by **Ron & Mary Humphries**

Description: to learn to use effective communication with parents, staff, and children

Objectives: to answer the following questions:

What is communication?

How do we communicate?

What are the barriers to communication?

How do we know we've communicated successfully?

How do we communicate when the situation is difficult?

Understanding that a child's role is to play, we will incorporate music and movement into their daily activities that include transitioning through the day, nap time, center time and much more! Ms. Kendra, who is also a children's recording artist, will use her very own music that has touched the lives of many in seminars and workshop throughout the states.

Listed below is a brief 3 hour segment breakdown of how the presenter will introduce and teach workshop:

1st hour- What are the different Learning Styles and how do we recognize them?

2nd hour- What is music and movement and how do we infuse into our early learning programs in a developmentally appropriate way.

3rd hour- Learning new songs, nursery rhymes, rhythm, beats and sounds.

Session M - Medication Administration and Food Safety by **Dianne Constant**

The goal of this session is to protect children who are receiving medication in childcare settings. An illness exclusion protocol is also addressed.

The objectives are as follows:

- Providers should have or will have a Medication Policy
- Use forms that best protect the children and the staff
- Address children with special health care needs
- Address confidentiality

Session N - Health, Safety and Risk Management in Early Childhood Education by **Clifshaque W. Stokes**

This course provides an introduction to basic health and safety standards and recommendations for child care centers. Participants will learn about indoor and outdoor safety, including minimizing hazards and creating safe, developmentally appropriate learning/play environments. Course content also focuses on hygiene and preventing the spread of infectious diseases. In addition, this course provides information on child abuse, including signs and symptoms as well as legal responsibilities.

Objectives: Successful participants will:

- define safety standards and practices an Early Childhood environment
- identify safe and age appropriate toys for children of various age groups and developmental levels
- identify basic procedures for preventing SIDS
- identify the four basic components of playground safety
- identify safe practices for preventing poisoning from plants, chemicals, and other materials
- identify common outdoor-related injuries to children
